For all Lantra Awards chainsaw courses you must have:

1 Chainsaw

- Rear or top-handed chainsaw that complies with requirements in AFAG Safety Guide 301. Top-handed chainsaws may only be operated on Lantra Awards training courses for arboriculture operations.
- The saw must have all the features marked on the diagram overleaf.
- The chainsaw should have a maximum guidebar length of 380mm/15".
- The chainsaw should be in good working order with no broken or missing parts. If attending a maintenance course, it can be in a condition requiring sharpening and normal operator maintenance. For all other courses, the saw should be sharp and ready to use.

NB: Any saw not meeting the above requirements cannot be maintained or used on any Lantra Awards course.

2 Fuel and oil for your saw

- Petrol/oil mix in an appropriate container
- Two stroke oil for mixing
- Chain oil (vegetable oils are recommended)

3 Personal first aid kit Hand cleanser/wet wipes

4 Operator's manual/specifications

- For your saw
- For your chain


5 Protective clothing

If you are using a chainsaw on a Lantra Awards training course you will be required to wear the protective clothing as listed below. All Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) manufactured or Imported since July 1995 must conform to a CE Standard. The relevant 'EN' Standard No's are printed in brackets.

The Health and Safety Executive recommend the following protective clothing is worn when a chainsaw is being used:

- A safety helmet which should be less than 3 years old or in accordance with manufacturers recommendations (complying with EN 397/EN 12492).
- Eye protection mesh visor (complying with
- EN 1731) or safety glasses (complying with EN 166).
- Hearing protection (complying with EN 352).
- Gloves* with protective guarding on the back of the left hand (complying with EN 381-7).
- Leg protection* incorporating chain clogging materials (complying with EN 381-5). All round protection is recommended for arborists and occasional users.
- **Protective boots*** (complying with BS ISO 20345: 2004)

These items should carry the CE chainsaw logo (complying with EN 381-3).



NB: If your saw or protective clothing is unsafe or unsuitable, the instructor may ask you to leave the course.

6 Basic maintenance tools

- Combination spanner/screwdriver
- Soft brush (to clean air filter)
- Round file and holder (suitable for your chain)
- Flat mill saw file
- Bar groove cleaner
- Depth gauge setting tool
- Grease gun and grease (if applicable to your saw)
- Feeler gauge to spark plug

7 Recommended spare parts to bring with you

- Spare files for your saw
- Spark plug
- Starter coil
- Starter spring
- Saw chain
- Air filter
- Fuel filter


For felling courses you must have:

- a filling clamp (stump vice)
- a felling lever
- plastic or alloy wedges.

In addition to the above you may also need the following items for certain courses:

- tool belt complete with:
 - o loggers tape
 - o tongs
 - o pulp hook.
- sledge hammer
- hand winch and strops
- turning strap.

Please check with your instructor or training provider.
